



A Range of Fabrics - I have cut these using two different sandwiches depending on what effect you require.

For all these experiments I have used the Standard Mat.

Soft Finish - By Soft Finish I mean just the fabric with no stiffening this is ideal for Patchwork and Applique - Use a sheet of Reynolds Freezer Paper on each side of the fabric, it peels off your fabric without causing any damage leaving your fabric as it was.

Stiffened Finish - Ideal for making structured items - Use an Iron on Medium Interfacing (iron on vilene 250) on the back of the fabric and a sheet of Reynolds Freezer Paper on the face side. The Reynolds Freezer Paper peels off and the Interfacing remains to leave you with a stiffened fabric which you can use to make bags like the one on the next page.

Machine Settings

The settings for your blade and pressure will vary depending on the thickness of the sandwich you have created.

Here are some settings as a starting point

(these may vary dependant on your machine and the prevailing humidity levels)

Material	Thickness	Blade	Pressure	Speed
Organza Fabric	0.15 = 0.32 with sandwich	1.5	15	3
Thin Fabric	0.25 = 0.40 with sandwich	2	18	3
Med Fabric	0.40 = 0.68 with sandwich	3	20	3
